Staycation in Berwick-Bayou Vista, Louisiana

Day One: Arrive in Berwick at Cypress Lake RV Park, 100 Cypress Rd, Berwick, 985-399-5981, Roy El Oak RV Park, Highway 182 and Lonely Oak Lane, Bayou Vista, 985-714-2184 or Two Sisters Landing, Two Sisters Court, off Highway 182, Bayou Vista, 985-714-0717

After parking and setting up the RV, fix an adult beverage and take time to relax.

Day Two and Day Three: Wake up and enjoy your morning coffee. If you'd like a brisk walk, drive over to the Berwick Walking Trail. The trail is 1.5-miles and passes along several canals, hardwood forests and fields, with designated spots for birdwatching. The trail begins on Gilmore Drive, about a half mile north of State Road 182, and concludes near the Atchafalaya River levee.

Fishing: If you're staying at Cypress Lake, you can fish in their lake. Rent an aluminum boat or pelican boat. Cash is needed. No fishing license is required.

For all others, you'll need a guide, Blue Dog Charters, 985-518-4277 or 985-384-2070. If you have your own boat, you'll need a launch, www.cajuncoast.com/sites/default/files/Cajun-Coast-Boat-Launches.pdf, fishing maps, Ivy's Tackle Box in Morgan City, 985-384-2070, 7209 Highway 182 E, Morgan City or Tideland Marine, 985-384-2724, 6805 LA-182, Morgan City, LA 70380 and an updated fishing license. Charlie's Pawn Shop, 6711 Highway 182 E, 985-384-7296, Ivy's Tackle Box or visit www.wlf.louisiana.gov/page/recreational-fishing-licenses-and-permits.

Paddling: If you're staying at Cypress Lake, you can rent canoes or kayaks. Cash is needed. If you have your own canoe or kayak, there are over 11 trails for paddlers to enjoy throughout St. Mary Parish.

Day Three or Day Four: After breakfast, it's time for touring. Visit the Everett Berry Lighthouse Park, Southwest Reef Lighthouse, Riverfront Berwick and the Brown House, Berwick's Heritage Museum, 3326 Third Street, Berwick, 985-384-2283. You may need to call to make an appointment. The Everett Berry Lighthouse Park and Brown House tell the story of the Berwick area. The Southwest Reef Lighthouse guided mariners into the Atchafalaya Bay for over 130 years before it was retired.

Walk around the downtown area and learn more about the Town of Berwick.

Day Four or Day Five: After breakfast, visit the Cajun Coast Welcome Center in Morgan City, 900 Dr. MLK Boulevard, 8224, for local information. Keep your eye out for local wildlife including

turtles, snakes, alligators, red tailed hawks, American bald eagles, rabbits, blue herons and egrets.

for a tour of the “Mr. Charlie.” The “Mr. Charlie” or the International Petroleum Museum & Exposition is the first submersible oil rig ever built and is considered an engineering marvel. Afterwards, visit the Diving/ROV Historical Preservation Room. For reservations, contact 985-384-3744. After the tour, enjoy a walk along the 21 Foot “Great Wall” bordering the Atchafalaya River in downtown Morgan City. Visit the Atchafalaya National Heritage Trail Kiosk and learn more about the river.

After lunch, visit the Wedell Williams Aviation Museum and Cypress Sawmill Museum in Patterson, 118 Cotten Road, Patterson, 985-399-1268. The Louisiana State Museum in Patterson documents Louisiana’s aviation history and the cypress museum documents the cypress industry of the area.

Day Five or Day Six: Touring

Captain Caviar Swamp Tours and **Captain Caviar Ghost Tour**, 112 Main Street, Patterson, 985-395-7420, adventure into the Atchafalaya Swamp Basin for 2.5 hours.

Historic Driving Tour of Franklin – Follow the Bayou Teche Scenic Byway into the Franklin and Charenton. Enjoy historic homes, shop along Franklin’s Main Street and tour the Chitimacha Museum in Charenton.
